Design Concept & Process:

This is one of a series of quilts, exploring the illusion of overlapping transparent triangles. The triangles were pieced from strips of fabric, hand dyed in value (light to dark) gradations of blue, yellow, green, and red. The light triangle on the dark ground was pieced separately from the dark triangle on the medium value ground. The two triangles were then cut into strips and sewn back together with strips of each triangle alternating to create the illusion of transparency.

The center of the quilt is surrounded by a border 1½" checks in graduated rainbow colors, floating on a black ground. Surrounding this is a narrow binding of rainbow colored fabric. The quilting was done in chevron patterns, echoing the triangles of the surface design.
